The Watts Township Board of Supervisors met in special advertised session at the Watts Buffalo Community Center at 6:30 PM. Present were Karl Raudensky, Charlie Louden, Pat Gutheil, Wendy Brunner, Jerry Spease and several residents.

Good and Welfare:

Darrin Miller expressed concern about the condition of the township roads after snow events. He has volunteered to help out to keep the roads safe. He will give personal information to the secretary.

Frank Poust expressed concern regarding giving a \$2.00 per hour raise to township employees in these hard times.

Zoning Officer:

Engineer:

Engineer Spease reports that he has contacted PaDOT regarding the Angie's Diner entrance and has discovered that they are all in compliance. However, the safety issue still exists and further investigation and communication with PaDOT will occur.

Solicitor:

Solicitor Fenicle reports that the Liddick and Hippman cases are awaiting the Judge's decision. The Rudy case was before District Justice Maguire and Rudy and Watts Township have agreed to work together to solve the issues and a new court date was set for April.

Fire Company:

A 2009 year end report was offered.

Old Business:

The Board reports that the Driveway Ordinance is still under review. The Board will attempt to finalize this by the February meeting. River Mist Zoning Change Request was tabled until February.

New Business:

New Supervisor Training will be held January 30 in State College and March 6 and 13 in Enola. Supervisors Raudensky and Gutheil will be attending.

The Supervisors have been invited to an elected officials luncheon at the Farm Show on January 14, 2010.

The Board has not made a firm commitment yet on an energy supplier. Rates will be updated and we will purchase electricity from the lowest bidder.

Roadmaster:

Several new road signs, including new Stop signs that meet new mandated reflective specifications, have been placed around the township. As stop signs are being taken down, the base sign will be returned to U S Municipal and resurfaced to meet those new standards.
